

ANNUAL REPORT

CITIZENS' ASSESSMENT DISTRICT ADVISORY COMMITTEE Sutter Butte Flood Control Agency

The Citizens' Assessment District Advisory Committee (CADAC) was established by the Sutter Butte Flood Control Agency (SBFCA) Board of Directors in May 2010. A charter was approved by the SBFCA Board in September 2010. Chapter VII. B. states that, "CADAC shall complete an annual report and provide it to the SBFC Board by June 30 of each year."

July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013

Mike Inamine requested CADAC's assistance in securing approval of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers 408 permit. CDAC members approved writing and sending a letter to the Corps of Engineers, co-signed by community agencies and groups, requesting approval of the 408 permit.

September 25, 2012 meeting: Mike Inamine, SBFCA Executive Director, provided updates on engineering, right-of-way and the budget. Michael Bessette, SBFCA Director of Engineering, spoke on the design and construction schedule. Seth Wurzel, SBFCA Budget Manager provided an update of the budget.

December 19, 2012 meeting: Jon Munger was re-elected chair and Lynette Filter was re-elected vice-chair. A presentation on bonds was given by budget manager Seth Wurzel and agency financial manager Dan Cox. They provided an overview of bond basics, including short-term vs. long-term debt and the recommended method of payment.

July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014

July 15, 2013 meeting: Executive Director Mike Inamine presented an update on SBFCA activities including the 408 process and start of construction.

CADAC received a letter from the Sutter County Taxpayers Association dated August 21, 2013, requesting the Committee to meet monthly.

September 3, 2013 meeting: Director of Engineering Michael Bessette gave an update on construction activities in the Shanghai Bend area. The Agency is awaiting 408 permit approval from the Corps of Engineers.

October 2, 2013 meeting: Discussion on the Administrative Manager position and Mike Inamine gave an update on agency activities.

November 6, 2013 meeting: Report by Michael Bessette on the conclusion of construction activities near Shanghai Bend. Discussion was held on the October 9, 2013 SBFCA board meeting which included a report on the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012.

December 20, 2013 meeting: Sandi Fredrickson was elected chair and Lynette Filter was re-elected vice-chair. Mike Inamine gave a report on agency activities and provided an update on the completed construction work which included 1.5 miles of slurry wall in Yuba City.

January 8, 2014 meeting: Discussion was held on CADAC operations and services. Mike Inamine provided an overview of the SBFCA Board meeting agenda for the next meeting which would include two properties that will go before the Board for a Resolution of Necessity Hearing.

February 5, 2014 meeting: Budget Manager Seth Wurzel presented a budget overview and detailed the funds for the accounting of the agency's finances. Mike Inamine gave an update on SBFCA activities and stated that SBFCA is accepting bids for a large levee improvement project along the Feather River. Estimated construction cost is \$90 to \$95 million.

March 5, 2014 meeting: Director of Engineering Michael Bessette reported the bid opening date for the 2014-2015 construction project will be March 20. The bid documents are for Project Areas B and D. This will be for a two-year construction contract. Funding is expected from the State in April.

April 2, 2014 meeting: Budget Manager Seth Wurzel gave a presentation on the proposed amended budget for fiscal years 2013-2016. Gross expenditures, funding sources and revenues were detailed.

May 7, 2014 meeting: Michael Bessette, Director of Engineering, explained the right-of-way acquisition process. Most landowners reach an agreement with SBFCA. A Resolution of Necessity Hearing is held if there is no agreement. If there is still no agreement after the Hearing a court case is filed with the Sutter County Superior Court. Many of these court cases have been settled with no further court proceedings. Kim Floyd, Public Outreach Manager passed out and explained an organizational chart for the Sutter Butte Flood Control Agency.

June 4, 2014 meeting: Mike Inamine, Executive Director, reported on agency and construction activities. Approved CADAC annual report

At all CADAC meetings there are updates on recent SBFCA meetings, discussion on public outreach strategies and discussion on committee vacancies. There is continuing concern on issuing of bonds, right-of-way issues and how they affect property owners and the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan and how it will affect the SBFCA project.
