REGULAR MEETING

Chair Sandi Fredrickson called the meeting to order at 12:30 p.m. Roll of the Committee was by introductions by each member present. Attendance is shown above. New members Vern Hartman and Barbara Rice were welcomed to the committee.

APPROVAL OF APRIL 1, 2015 MEETING MINUTES

Minutes of the April 1, 2015 meeting will be filed as presented.

UPDATE ON SBFCA ACTIVITIES

Michael Bessette reported that levee construction work could have started on April 15 but the start date has been delayed due to mitigation of the Native American cultural resources issues. SBFCA staff members have been working on a response to the State Native American Heritage Commission due by May 13. If this response is not accepted litigation will occur. For Butte County levees SBFCA will be working with Enterprise Rancheria instead of the United Auburn

Indian Community as the most likely descendants. Levee Areas B and C are completed with the exception of three “gap” areas. These are where the pipe for Yuba City potable water from the Feather River is, where the Union Pacific railroad track crosses the levee and at the base of the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge. Right of way permits for Area D are nearing completion. An emergency response plan is close to finalizing. A bond not to exceed \$50 million will be issued. The funds will be used to pay off the Rabobank line of credit and for ongoing construction work and related costs. The bond will be for 30 years and will be paid for with levee benefit assessment money.

#### NEXT CADAC MEETING

The next Citizens’ Assessment District Advisory Committee meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 3, at 12:30 p.m. at 1441 Garden Highway, Yuba City. The location is on the west side of Garden Highway north of Bogue Road and is across from Blackburn-Talley Park.
